- 3. Be inclusive and welcome new members.
- 4. Be kind to our volunteers. They are giving their time to ensure our activities run smoothly. If you have any issue with a procedure, please ask to speak to a board member.
- 5. Respect and maintain confidentiality of any information gained as a director, member or volunteer.
- 6. When volunteering at an event, follow all of the event rules and regulations.
- 7. Avoid any perceived conflict of interest.

Unacceptable behaviour includes: creating a disturbance, verbal or physical conflicts, making fun of someone else, inappropriate comments that make someone feel uncomfortable, yelling, use of profanity, harassment, disrespectful or critical comments, racial slurs, intimidating or threatening others, disruption of a program or event.

If you witness or are subjected to unacceptable behaviour, **please do not engage** the person. Tell a board member **right away** so they are able to deal with it.

Failure to comply with the Code of Conduct may result in progressive discipline, which could include verbal or written warnings, removal from the facility or possible ban from returning to a program or event for a specific period of time.
